Tips, Before You Travel This Summer



Below are some tips that you may like to take into consideration before heading into the busy holiday season.

- Have your vehicle checked. Automotive Solutions Members offer safety checks for tyre tread and pressure, lights, brakes, cooling systems and other components. (A well tuned vehicle is also more fuel efficient so you'll also save money on fuel costs).
- **Ensure your warrant of fitness**, road users, and registration are all up to date.
- **Be alert to changes.** Often during holiday periods, passing lanes are closed to help reduce congestion and prevent further delays where the traffic merges at the end of lanes. Sometimes alternative routes are suggested.
- Check out updates about highways that you may use www.nzta.govt.nz/traffic/current-conditions/highway-info/index.html for real time updates about route changes, delays, closures and incidents.
- Check that you have a current drivers licence and that it hasn't expired or is close to expiry if you get caught without a current or valid license it could cost you \$400+.
- **Check your trailers and caravans.** Check all towing attachments and make sure the couplings are compatible. Also remember to check the safety chain, trailer lights, tyres and brakes.

How much can your vehicle safely tow?

Most vehicles have tow ratings provided when purchased by the manufacturer specifying the gross trailer weight braked, unbraked, or both, that the vehicle can safely tow.

Although the law does not require these tow ratings to be followed, Land Transport New Zealand recommends that they be taken into account.

In addition to the requirements above, the law requires that every light vehicle and trailer combination must be capable of stopping within a distance of seven metres from a speed of 30 km/h. In effect, this means that the maximum allowable weight of an unbraked trailer is limited by the weight and braking ability of the vehicle being used to tow it.

Land Transport NZ recommends, as a guide, that the laden weight of an



unbraked trailer should not exceed three quarters of the unladen weight of the towing vehicle and then only if the towing vehicle's brakes and tyres are in excellent condition.

NOTE Remember that a car, utility vehicle or light van is not permitted to tow more than one trailer or vehicle.



- Insert copper wire into the trunk of your tomato plant, this will help to keep early and late blight at bay.
